

Notes From The Director

This is T-Time's 6th mainstage production. No show has been like the other, except for the fact that they all have surprised expectations. You Can't Take It With You (YCTIWY) is simply another example of that.

When it came to selecting a show, a drama crossed my mind but only briefly—comedy is what this group does incredibly well—both on stage and off. This show has been done before at Independence not too long ago and I wasn't sure I wanted to repeat a previous production; yet, I kept coming back to this title.

In what has turned out to be the shortest rehearsal process we've had, I've watched these young actors come alive in the amazing characters they've created and a crew that has helped bring together every aspect of the production, on and off the stage. They worked hard from day one, researching the 1930's—where we all realized that perhaps there were some similarities to our lives now that we didn't expect to find.

Over the last 6 weeks, these kids have worked to the point of exhaustion—due in great part to all of the laughter caused from every rehearsal. IT has been nothing short of a pleasure working with them. For some, this is our 6th show together, for others, it's a first. But like, the crazy Sycamores, it feels like a family—everyone bringing their different fits, personalities and stories to the table. Like the characters, this group of kids is unforgettable.

This isn't just any old show...it's one of the most iconic comedies done both in movies and on the stage. It's our hope that you do the opposite of the title, and really take something with you—do what you love, love what you do.


